JOHAN VAN THULL: FINALLY BACK ON THE MOTORBIKE AFTER FOUR YEARS



"I have got my life back again."

"For 10 years I was unaware that I had diabetes. That really took its toll on my body. Due to neuropathy, a type of nerve damage, I lost feeling in my lower legs. As a result, more than four years ago, I did not notice a foot wound which would not close. I then started a program at the Radboud UMC Wound Expertise Centre (RUWEC). For a wound to heal it is very important that there is absolutely no pressure on the wound. I had a full cast on my lower leg and was not allowed to walk, not even to the toilet or the shower without a wheelchair. The plaster was replaced weekly for four years! A range of medications and treatments were used regularly: antibiotics, all kinds of creams, wound treatments,

everything that was available. The wound shrunk, but remained open. After 4 years, I was told in December 2021 that the risk was very high that the inflammation would spread to the rest of my leg; it was better to take off my lower leg now than the whole leg at a later date. The amputation was already planned."

"You have no idea what it feels like to be locked up for years, to be isolated from society in one fell swoop."

"In November 2021 I saw the Editie NL broadcast with Plasmacure on RTL4. I contacted my internist about this treatment. She contacted the RUWEC wound care contact. In December he started PLASOMA treatment. After 9 weeks the wound was closed! I got my life back and I am eternally grateful to Plasmacure! This recovery makes life much easier."
